OSKA

How many people and which skills are needed in our labour market today and tomorrow?

Where and how to aquire those skills?

What should be changed in labour policy, educational system, lifelong learning, etc. to meet the future needs

3 types of studies


Sectoral studies

OSKA quantitative data model combines data from:

Registry of employment
Registry of education
Registry of population
Registry of residents permits
Registry of work visas
And other registries necessery for certain sector



Demand and supply model of workforce in OSKA forecasts




Reports on 5 economic sectors every year


Forecast horizon 10 years


Forecasting model:




Demand and supply model of workforce in OSKA forecasts

The aim of the study: how much foreign labour Estonian labour market needs till 2035 and in which sectors and skills level?




Foreign labour consist of workers:


both from EU countries and from third countries

have temporary permits to live or work or study in Estonia


have work visa and short-term working registration in Estonia
